Personal Body Safety

Tips for Talking with Children





- Let your child know that you support them and will listen to them
 - It is never their fault
 - You will always believe them
- Secrets vs surprises
 - Never to keep unsafe secrets from you
 - Remind them to tell you whenever they feel uncomfortable or unsafe
- Help children identify trusted adults
 - At home, school, other places
 - Include yourself

- Talk with children regularly about personal safety
 - Including feelings/instincts, personal boundaries, and types of touches
 - Family safety nights
- Use proper terminology for the private parts of the body
 - Nicknames can cause confusion and shame
- Respect children's bodies and their right to say "NO!" to anyone
 - Ex. Do not force a child to hug or sit on someone's lap









Talk about consent

- Consent is giving permission
- Everyone should ask permission for all touches



- Teach children they deserve to be safe and treated with respect
- Warning signs of unhealthy and abusive/unsafe

When/how to seek help

- Bystanders vs. upstanders
- Peers vs. adults
- Safety planning
- Accessing community resources







If a child discloses to you

DO NOT:	
	make promises you can't keep
	make judgmental or threatening remarks about alleged perpetrator
	interrupt while they are sharing with you
	ask them questions such as "why did this happen"
	investigate (ex. Ask to see bruises)

If a child discloses to you

DO:	
	remain calm and listen
	let them know you are proud of them and that they are not alone
	thank them for telling you
	let them know it's not their fault
	Respect the child's right to confidentiality
	Call for help: SCFF , Law enforcement, NYS Child Abuse Hotline

What You Can Do

- Keep communication open
 - Open-ended questions
 - Check ins
- Establish/model healthy boundaries
- Be informed
 - Have current information
 - Recognize troubling behavior and respond appropriately
