CALL TO ORDER

REGULAR SESSION

They will be sponsoring a variety of activities throughout the year to help raise awareness and money for children with disabilities. They wanted everyone to know of the plans and how they can become part of this very worthy and inspirational campaign.

DISTRICT COMPONENT UPDATES

A financial update was provided by Mr. Hilker, School Business Administrator. 90% of school taxes have been collected to date. The Auditor's Report for 2013-14 records will be submitted to the Board later in the meeting. There were no current year findings by the auditor, only existing items relating to Extra-Classroom Activity Accounts and fund balances. Fund balances will be addressed through the three year plan which the Board will be a part of. The Board questioned why Extra-Classroom Activity Accounts seem to appear each year where the District is not, for example, closing accounts when there is no activity in the account for a one year period as required. Each Student Activity Club will be providing an update to the Board during the school year. There will an opportunity to address any questions they may have. The Budget Development Calendar for 2015-16 will be submitted for approval later in the meeting. The District's new financial software will be used as a medium for budget development this year. Questar III State Aide Planning Services recently visited the District. They are willing to come back at any time to offer their assistance. The District will be looking at transportation cost allocations and costs for high need students to possibly minimize some of these expenses. It was reported that the District's last Capital Project was not closed out as properly as it should have been. Mr. Hilker is sorting through boxes of documents in an attempt to correct the situation as we need to close out one project before beginning another one.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Mr. Shine reported on this year's Homecoming and Eagle Landing. The saying, "Many hands make light work" certainly was the case in preparing Eagle Landing for its debut at the ribbon cutting ceremony at Homecoming 2014. Thanks to a huge team effort of community members, staff, administrators and the board of education president, the task was completed in time for Homecoming. Eagle Landing, a multi-purposed outdoor area outside the front entrance to the Junior/Senior High School, offers a sand volleyball area, two regulation bocce ball courts, a grass field for soccer, lacrosse, flag football and tag games. There are also two eagle benches, picnic tables, two permanent outdoor garbage cans, two feather flags and a resurfaced basketball court. The wet area by the basketball court has been transformed into horseshoe pits and a wall ball court. Eagle Landing is available for physical education classes, lunch recess and after-school and weekend recreation.

Despite rainy weather for the third consecutive year and a lot of scurrying around making last-minute switches to the original Homecoming 2014 schedule, Junior/Senior High School Associate Principal/Athletic Director Brita Donovan said Homecoming 2014 was very well attended. She said, "We had double the crowds from last year and the shuttle was busy going between the Junior/Senior High School parking lot to the Joseph Henry Elementary School parking lot. "The only thing that was cancelled was the youth soccer games, but we were able to get everything else in that was scheduled. We moved the Beach Volleyball inside. We'll have a tournament outside on our new beach volleyball court in the spring." School Superintendent Shannon Shine said, "This year's Homecoming was arguably the best Galway has ever had. Even with a last-minute schedule change due to weather, there was a potentially record-breaking turnout from the community. The ribbon-cutting for Eagle Landing also heralded the advent of a new school and community resource which will be enjoyed for generations. There is a high level of collaboration involved in making such a successful homecoming celebration. The credit belongs to the many volunteers and contributors, of whom there were many; however, the vision for the homecomina well Eagle Landing belonas with Mrs. Donovan."

Board of Education President Dennis E. Schaperjahn added, "The preparations for Homecoming and the ideas along with the physical labor involved so many people from the community and school. Please accept my THANKS, for a great job and memory. I'm very proud of both for working together and accomplishing so much, Galway School District. Please enjoy your Eagles Landing." On Saturday night of the Homecoming, nearly 180 students in grades 9-12 attended the Homecoming Dance that was coordinated by Student Senate. Glow necklaces along with chips and water were provided. Students danced to music played by student disc jockey Jacob Ernst. Student Senate also coordinated Spirit Week that led up to Homecoming.

Mr. Shine reported that in an attempt to provide additional communication to the Board, Building Principals will be providing Data Meeting overviews to the Board on a regular basis and a monthly update of what is happening in their building. This update will be provided at each regular meeting of the Board.

It was asked that the Guidance Department be informed in advance if the District were to revise course descriptions to see if the impact could disqualify some of our athletes. The Board was encouraged to attend some sporting events to see our teams play.
