Galway Central School is a rural school district located in Saratoga County. The school district encompasses an area of 100 square miles. The population of the school is 850 with approximately 250 students in grades 9-12. The graduating class of 2023 has 62 students.

Accreditation: Galway Central School is registered with and accredited by the New York State Board of Regents.

Curriculum: 22 credits are required as a minimum for graduation.

Honors Curriculum

Honors courses offered in Science, English, Math, Spanish, and History.

The high school offers a total of 26 courses in which students can earn college credit. These include 2 Advanced Placement course and 24 courses that have been certified by specific New York colleges as equivalent to one of their courses and credit-bearing.

Grading: Grading scale - 0-100. Minimum passing grade - 65

GPA: The GPA is calculated using all courses. All full-year courses count equally toward the GPA; half year courses have a multiplier of 0.5. Honors and college courses are weighted; honors courses weighted by 1.03 and college courses weighted by 1.06.

Class Rank: Class rank is determined by the average GPA for final course grades.
